

Harvard Heights (2000)



THE HARVARD HEIGHTS HPOZ, PREDOMINANTLY COMPOSED OF TWO-story Transitional Arts and Crafts-style homes, is a remarkably consistent neighborhood built from 1902–1908. The large and somewhat grand scale of the homes in this area is due to a land covenant that stipulated that all houses built within the tract cost more than \$2,500, a substantial sum at the turn of the century. The site of the only surviving Greene and Greene house in the City of Los Angeles, the neighborhood also features the work of the famous Heineman brothers as well as notable West Adams architect Frank Tyler. The HPOZ also includes modest commercial buildings on Venice and Washington Boulevards, and along the edges of the neighborhood.
