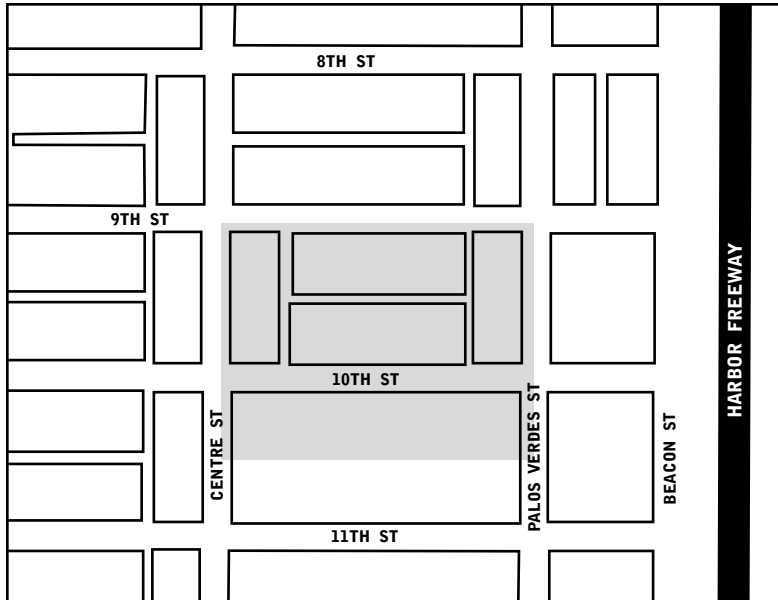


Vinegar Hill (2001)



VINEGAR HILL, AN EARLY SUBURB OF SAN PEDRO, IS a neighborhood of tree-lined streets and charming homes built overlooking the harbor by successful San Pedro businessmen. The harbor area was home to a diverse immigrant population, a trend that continues to this day. It is rumored that Vinegar Hill acquired its name due to a cottage industry of home-brewed wine. This residential neighborhood of modest single-family homes, built from 1886 through 1927, is marked by the diversity of its founding residents, and so various Revival styles such as American Colonial and Spanish Colonial Revival can be found intermixed with Queen Anne, American Foursquare, and Craftsman architecture.
