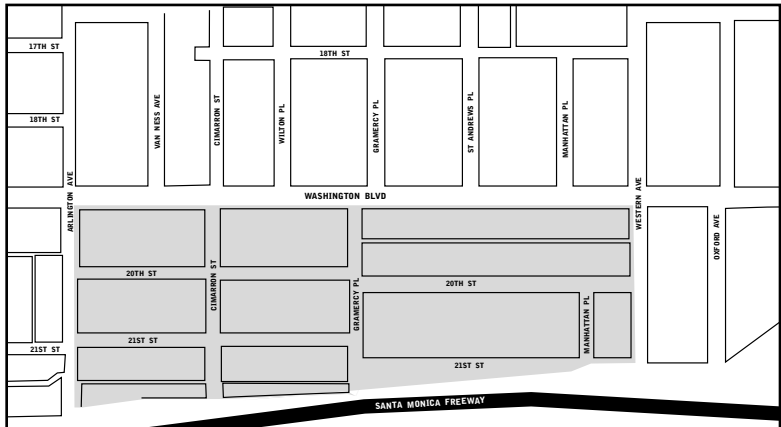


Western Heights (2001)



LOCATED JUST NORTH OF THE SANTA MONICA Freeway in Historic West Adams, the six-block Western Heights HPOZ consists primarily of architecturally intact single-family homes. Although most are built in the Craftsman or Tudor Revival style, the neighborhood also includes Spanish Revival, Mediterranean, Queen Anne cottage, and Colonial Revival homes. In addition to diverse architectural styles, the HPOZ contains a range of building types, including one of Los Angeles' earliest apartment buildings and other original examples of multi-family housing scattered among the single-family homes. Some of the city's most prominent architects, including Paul R. Williams, Myron Hunt, and Frank Tyler, designed houses in this area. The HPOZ also takes pride in having been home to one of the original families to challenge restrictive racial covenants in the late 1940s.
