TOURS AT A GLANCE

Led by trained L.A. Conservancy docents, our interactive tours support **California's Common Core Standards in History and Social Studies**, and feature stories of downtown L.A.'s historic people and places.

- Open to schools, community groups, or anyone working with youth in grades 3-12
- Begin a block away from Metro stations
- Offered year round Monday – Saturday, 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.
- Last approximately 2 hours, but can be modified to meet your needs
- Cost \$10 per student* (1 free chaperone per 12 students)

TOUR OPTIONS

HISTORIC DOWNTOWN

Explore some of L.A.'s most beloved landmarks, such as the Central Library, Angels Flight, and the Bradbury Building. This tour offers a great overview of downtown L.A. history and architecture, from the nineteenth century to the present.

UNION STATION

Understand the backstory of L.A.'s iconic transportation center: Union Station, the last great railway station built during the golden age of rail travel.

Recommended for grades 3 - 5

A WOMAN'S PLACE: UNION STATION & CHINATOWN

Discover the linked history of two unique areas of downtown L.A. through the stories of women who had a lasting impact on these sites.
