Sarah Leonard Fine Jewelers was established in 1946 by a husband and wife named Sarah and Leonard. The store is a third-generation legacy business. Legacy businesses are long-standing neighborhood anchors where people connect, memories are made, and our sense of community is nourished. # Tehrangeles & Persian Square

Great job touring Westwood Village! Now it's time to explore Tehrangeles, an area that is important to the heritage and history of Iranian Americans. Tehrangeles is home to legacy businesses founded by Iranian American community members, many of whom fled Iran in the 70s and 80s following the Iranian Revolution. A large group of Iranians arrived in Los Angeles in and around the neighborhood of Westwood. Over time businesses were created and a community was formed.

The area is known as Tehrangeles which combines Tehran, the capital of Iran, and Los Angeles. Walk along Westwood Blvd. What type of businesses do you observe? Step inside your favorite and be sure to say hello!

## **6** When you reach Persian Square at the intersection of Wilkins and Westwood Blvd. find Attari Plaza.

Attari Plaza is where one of the first businesses started by an Iranian American was established. Write the name of two businesses that can be found at the plaza now.

## **7** Walk back to Persian Square and look across the street for Saffron and Rose Persian Ice Cream.

Saffron and Rose Persian Ice Cream is a family-owned legacy business that started crafting unique Persian ice cream in 1974 for the growing Persian community of Westwood. The establishment was started by Ali Kashani-Rafye who is nicknamed "Haji" to his friends. The ice cream shop was recently remodeled by Haji's grandson, Freddy, who has helped his family's business grow and expand. Complete the word scramble on the next page!
